Armond: Alternate member Sue Hessel was seated for absent regular member Tom Reynolds.

**REGULAR MEETING**

**Sue Tiffany, Hamburg Road, Tax Map 26 Lot 34; an application to repair the spillway on the existing farm pond.**

Present at the meeting was Dave Tiffany.

Tiffany presented the Commission with information packets.

Gigliotti confirmed that an authorization letter was received from Sue Tiffany authorizing Dave Tiffany to speak on her behalf.

Tiffany supplied Gigliotti with certified letter receipts.

Commission members took a moment to read a letter describing the project. Ariel views were presented to the Commission.

Tiffany: Todd Machnik has agreed help with this project. The pond is small with a simple set up.

Dill: Is it a rubber mat?

Tiffany: We are not sure which we will get.
