



SELECTMEN'S MINUTES  
MONDAY, APRIL 1, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 3:39 P.M. and the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

The board reappointed three members of the Cemetery Commission to new six-year terms; Christine Plikus, Diana Boehning and Thomas Davies.

The board authorized the First Selectman to approve the use of the town's roads for the ALSTDI Tri-State Trek charity bicycle ride on June 21-23, 2019.

The Board congratulated the Open Space Coordinator, Wendy Hill, for acquiring two grants for the eradication of invasive species from the National Audubon Society and the Eightmile River Watershed Grant program.

The Board agreed to correct the minutes of February 4, 2019 concerning the Tax Collector's policy for tax sales. The wording was revised to read ... "when a property has become two years in arrears or owing more than \$10,000."

The Board discussed an opening on the Regional Planning Committee and agreed to make the ZEO and P&Z Committee aware of this opening in the hope that a candidate will be brought forward.

Selectman Kiker discussed the Spring 2019 Selectmen's Newsletter that will be mailed shortly along with the next Citizen Spotlight article for the website. The board approved his work and thanked him for the continued communication efforts.

The Board moved the meeting outside in order to raise a flag in honor of National Donate Life Month and supporting the effort to increase organ donation. The flag will remain flying for the month of April in hope of increasing awareness of the need for organ donations.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:12 P.M.
