



SELECTMEN'S MINUTES  
MONDAY, JUNE 3, 2019

Present: Parker Lord, John Kiker, Steven Mattson

The meeting was called to order at 3:35 P.M. and the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

The board continued its discussion regarding making the GIS mapping system available on-line. The pros and cons were again discussed, it was noted that almost all other CT towns make this information available, and the consensus was reached to provide this data. It was the opinion of the board that the public information should be made available on-line as it is at town hall.

The arrangements for the annual July 4<sup>th</sup> parade were discussed. The state road permit has been acquired, police coverage is being arranged, Selectman Kiker will arrange for the Grand Marshal car and Don Gerber was selected to be this year's Grand Marshal.

The board again discussed the need for candidates to populate a joint Lyme/Old Lyme building committee to study the need for an expansion of the Senior Center to accommodate a growing number of programs and participants. Two candidates have agreed to serve and two more will be located.

The board was advised that the Marchesi family has notified the town that they will be seeking an injunction against the town's plan to reclaim the final stretch of Brockway Ferry Road and facilitate access to the CT River. The courts will again decide the ability of the town to control the road.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:38 P.M.
