



SELECTMEN'S MINUTES
MONDAY JULY 1, 2019

Present: Parker Lord, John Kiker, Steven Mattson

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 P.M. and the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

Selectman Lord was welcomed back after an illness and best wishes for his continued recovery were conveyed.

Selectman Kiker confirmed the arrangements for the Grand Marshal car for the July 4th parade.

The board continued its discussion regarding making the GIS mapping system available on-line. The roll-out has been delayed pending the update of property tax card information. A disclaimer to the mapping system will be added that explains the limitations of the mapping depiction and the need for validation prior to use by the public.

The Assessor and building department have launched a review of the mapping data to update the presence and location of buildings on all lots.

CT DOT has announced a delay in the paving project for rte. 156 that had been scheduled for this summer and will now take place next year hopefully.

The board was updated on the request for opinions from the Land Trust and P&Z Commission concerning the continuation of the maple tree tapping on Mt Archer Woods. Following receipt of these opinions the board will make a decision whether to extend this agricultural use on town property.

The board discussed a water run-off situation on Joshuatown Road that has created a driveway issue for the residents involved. The town will meet with the residents to discuss that the driveway traverses state property and repairs are needed, by the state or the residents, to address the problem.

The town has been served with a civil summons by the Marchesi family claiming abandonment of the terminus of Brockway Ferry Road and a petition for an injunction prohibiting the town from reclaiming the road. Legal counsel will represent the town in these continuing proceedings.

A tax refund request in the amount of \$326.63 was approved.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:28 P.M.
