What is animal tracking? Animal Tracking is the ability to gather evidence of local wildlife like tracks, scat & other animal sign, and then use these clues to interpret animal behavior and locate wildlife in the environment.

What Is A Track? A track is the impression of an animals foot after it walks in any soft substrate like sand, mud, silt or snow. Animal tracks tell the stories of the wild: winter snow or mud are ideal conditions for spotting tracks.
