



SELECTMEN'S MINUTES  
TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 20, 2022

Present: John Kiker, David Lahm, and Kristina White.

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 P.M. and the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

The Board approved two tax refund requests.

The Board discussed the upcoming dissolution of the Materials Innovation and Recycling Authority and the impact that will have on the Town's Municipal Solid Waste Disposal (MSW). The Board authorized Selectman Lahm to begin the search for alternatives for Lyme's MSW.

The Board authorized Selectman Lahm to pursue the offer to donate Carey Island to the Town. Selectman Lahm stated that he had already coordinated with the Town Attorney as to the procedures to accept said gift.

The Board voted to authorize Selectman Lahm to issue a nonbinding letter in support of the "Victory Flocks" program.

The appointment scheduled for action was tabled until a later meeting.

Old Business - Selectwoman White updated the board on her research into more efficient forms of recycling with the possibility of obtaining grants from Sustainable CT.

New Business – Selectman Lahm alerted the Board of a ballot referendum concerning a bonding request for Regional District 18 to be held concurrently with the November 8<sup>th</sup> elections. Staffing and election procedural issues were discussed.

Selectman Lahm informed the Board that, due to the high price of heating fuel, the Town will be providing \$1,000 to the Town energy fund to assist certain residents who run out of fuel.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:00 P.M.
