Meeting May 15, 2024

The Lyme Conservation Commission/ Inland Wetlands & Watercourses Agency held a Regular Meeting on Wednesday, May 15, 2024, at 7:00 p.m. at the Lyme Town Hall, 480 Hamburg Road Lyme, CT 06371, to hear the following:

Call to Order 7:00 p.m.

Seat Alternate Member – Alternate member Fox was seated for absent member Hessel.

Regular Meeting

Continuation of Gwendlynn Hastedt; 169-2 Blood St. Map 40.1, Lot 16; An application for an addition on a house within the Upland Review Area: Present was Gwen & Andy Hastedt.

Hastedt reviewed the updated site plan with the Construction sequence, a note that there will be no stockpile during construction, a silt fence mapped closer to the house, and an approval letter from George at LLHD. He said they would like to start as soon as possible, and it will take about a year. Crowley made a motion to approve the application with the updated presented site plan. Seconded by Lombardozzi.

New Business

Discussion of Forest Management for Open Space: Continued to next month.

Old Business

73 Ferry Rd. Update: Present was Bob Doane and Property owner Harold Horwich.

Doane spoke, showed the site plan, and described the proposed planting sequence. Doane said he is working with Rich Snarsky and that Snarsky said the stream plants will have topsoil, a deep, larger root ball; they will compact it in and then place the stones back over. This will help keep everything stable during high waters. Doane also said Snarsky commented that invasives that are currently on the bank should remain but can be cut down to two feet tall. There will be maintenance until a follow-up with P&Z in the fall to let things grow back naturally. The commission discussed they would like a follow up as well. Site walk to be held prior to an update at September's meeting.

Approval of minutes from the April 17, 2024, meeting: Dill said he mentioned using organic fertilizer if necessary. Crowley made a motion to approve the minutes with corrections. Darnell seconded. Kegley abstained. Unanimous.
