



SELECTPEOPLES'S MINUTES
Monday, June 17, 2024

Present: John Kiker, Kristina White, David Lahm.

The meeting was called to order at 4:04 P.M. and the minutes of the previous meeting were accepted.

One tax refund request, for an overpayment, was approved.

Selectman Lahm briefed the Board on the close out of the current fiscal year. The only area that was close to coming in over budget was the area of General Government where high maintenance costs for the Library HVAC system stressed that department's limits.

The Mitchell Hill Road repair project is going well and should be completed by July 1st.

David Tiffany was appointed to the Open Space Commission

Sustainability Initiative: Selectman Lahm briefed the Board on a company called "BluSky" that converts organic material, including invasives, to bio char. The company's storage site is in the Middletown area which may be too far for residents to take their invasives. Selectwomen White suggested that a container be placed at the transfer station as a collection point. Selectman Lahm will investigate the feasibility.

Old Business – Food Composting Buckets – Rick Keel will have 21 buckets to sell at the Long Table Farm Market on Saturday, June 22nd. Cash or check.

New Business –

The Board of Selectpeople voted unanimously to support, endorse and oversee the application of Lyme Grange 147 for the Neighborhood Assistance Act Tax Credit Program.

The Chairs of the POCD Sub Committee and P&Z Commission discussed the status of the POCD questionnaire, deployment of the questionnaire and the collection of data. The Board noted that the process was progressing smoothly.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:57.
